DECLARATION OF EXTENSION OF CARLSBAD UNDERGROUND WATER BASIN

WHEREAS, the waters of underground streams, channels, artesian basins, reservoirs, or lakes, having reasonably ascertainable boundaries, are public waters and are subject to appropriation for beneficial use, and

WHEREAS, all natural waters flowing in streams and watercourses, whether such be perennial or torrential, within the State of New Mexico, belong to the public and are subject to appropriation for beneficial use, and

WHEREAS, the Carlsbad Underground Water Basin has been declared by order of the State Engineer dated October 16, 1947, and by a subsequent order dated October 21, 1952 extending the basin, and

WHEREAS, it now appears that the area defined and bounded by the original declaration and subsequent extension does not include a part of the basin lying adjacent thereto which has reasonably ascertainable boundaries and in a part of which, at least, development and use of ground waters is now feasible.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that the area im Eddy
County more fully described hereimafter is a part of the Carlsbad
Underground Water Basim subject to the New Mexico Statutes and the
rules and regulations of the State Engineer:
