1. Call to Order

The meeting of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) was called to order at 11:50 a.m. on August 11, 1999 by Dennis Foltz, Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments (MRGCOG) Executive Director.

A quorum was present.

2. Approval of Agenda

Mr. Frank Faustine, City of Rio Rancho, made a motion to:

APPROVE THE AGENDA AS WRITTEN.

Mr. Richard Jaramillo, City of Belen, seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

3. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Foltz announced that if any of our local governments need to use our new conference room, it will be available. Please contact Loretta Humble, Middle Rio Grande Council Of Governments.

Mr. Foltz reviewed the MRGCOG meeting rules:

- Parking is provided for Board Members or their alternates. All others are asked to park in the visitors parking, on the street, or at the Baptist Church parking lot on the south side of Tijeras Street.
- Please sign in upon arrival at the meeting.
- Please turn off ringer on cell phones and pagers.
- Board Members or their alternates are to sit at the table. If both the member and the alternate are present, the alternate is asked to sit in the audience.
- Ex-Officio, Advisory, or Associate Members are asked to sit where noted at the table.
- Persons wishing to address the Board under Public Comments or on a specific agenda item are asked to register with the Staff Secretary.
- The Chair can place time limits on public comments and presentations.
- All handouts are to be presented to the Staff Secretary for distribution at the meeting. If you provide your own copies, please call the Staff Secretary to find out how many copies you need to provide.
- The agenda is finalized two weeks prior to the meeting, if you wish to have an item placed on the agenda, please contact our office before this deadline.

Mr. Foltz mentioned that the lunch today was provided for the Board by MRGCOG. A request has been submitted to the MRGCOG Executive Board to supply the lunches at MRGWRB. He will report on the Executive Board's response at the next MRGWRB meeting.

Mr. Foltz deferred the discussion of the contract with the Interstate Stream Commission as an Information Item.

Mr. Foltz briefly reported that he has begun speaking with the New Mexico Congressional Delegation in Washington, D.C. about continuing funding for water planning in the Middle Rio Grande Region. The contract with the Interstate Stream Commission is limited; additional funding will be needed to continue the water planning program into the future.

4. Public Comments

Their were no public comments

5. Approval of Summaries

Ms. Mary Murnane, Bernalillo County, requested that under Item 5, Review of Bylaws. Paragraph 2 the fourth bullet be corrected to read: 40 acre-feet per year.

Mr. Larry Blair, City of Albuquerque, made a motion to:

APPROVE THE JULY 19, 1999 SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS AS AMENDED.

Mr. Faustine seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

6. Nomination of Officers

After some discussion, it appeared that the Board was still not ready to elect officers, Mr. Foltz suggested that the Board might consider electing a Nominating Committee to select members to run for these positions. David Stoliker, Southern Sandoval County Arroyo Flood Control Authority, Mary Murnane, Bernalillo County and Danny Hernandez, Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority volunteered to serve on this committee. They will select candidates from the primary members.

Following a discussion regarding whether an alternate would be eligible to serve as an officer of this board, Mr. Stoliker, made a motion to:

RECOMMEND THAT ALTERNATES CANNOT SERVE AS AN OFFICER OF THE MRGWRB.

Mr. Hernandez seconded the motion.

Those voting in favor of the motion were: Ms. Betty Behrend, Village of Los Lunas; Mr. Blair, Mr. Faustine, Mr. James Fernandez, Valencia County; Mr. Joseph Griego, Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District; Mr. Daniel Hernandez, Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority; Mr. Jaramillo; Ms. Murnane; Commissioner Sapien, Sandoval County; Mr. John Sorrell, Isleta Pueblo; and Mr. David Stoliker, Southern Sandoval County Arroyo Flood Control Authority.

Those voting against the motion: Ms. Marianne Woodard, Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque.

The motion carried by a vote of 11 for, and one against.

7. Mr. Joe Quintana, MRGCOG Staff, reviewed the changes to the Bylaws which were suggested at the last Board meeting. A copy of those changes were provided to the members as a handout.

<u>Policy Ramifications</u>: The membership and decision making process defined by the Bylaws of the Water Board is critical to its function and must be acceptable to the members of the Water Board.

Financial Impact: None.

Ms. Deb Hibbard, Alliance for the Rio Grande Heritage registered to address the Board on this issue. She stated that as provided for in the Bylaws, advocates for the Rio Grande and would be petitioning the MRGWRB to become an Ex-Officio Member.

Mr. Sorrell, stated his concerns about how the weighed voting system is determined, and who holds the water rights. The State of New Mexico has not recognized the Native Americans as having water rights in the Middle Rio Grande.

Mr. Blair, commented that the purpose of this Board is to get a Regional Water Plan done. The implementation of this Plan will still come back to those with the authority to implement it. If the entities do not participate in the Plan, then this will never be implemented. The Water Providers Council will be dominant and the MRGWRB will act as a strong advisory member to that Council. Anyone can hold water rights, but only a few entities are water providers for a public purpose. They are The Pueblos, The Conservancy District, The City of Albuquerque and The City of Rio Rancho.

Mr. Foltz, suggested that the Board elect a subcommittee to review this issue and bring their findings back to the Board.

Mr. Stoliker made a motion to:

RECOMMEND TO THE MRGCOG BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT REVISIONS TO THE MRGWRB BYLAWS BE APPROVED AS WRITTEN.

Ms. Woodard seconded the motion.

Mr. Tony Secatero, President, Canoncito Pueblo expressed concerns and questions regarding the MRGWRB:

- The Rio Puerco is not included in the planning area.
- No Navajo Governments are listed.
- There is a Duplication of Memberships to agencies, counties and cities.
- The rapid expansion of Rio Rancho and the City of Albuquerque to the West.
- What action or plans have been made to cover those areas?
- What is the authority of this Board?

Mr. Foltz explained that the Interstate Stream Commission and the State Engineers Office is promoting regional water planning activities in the State. They have designated the Middle Rio Grande area as a water planning region and have requested that a regional water plan be developed for this area. MRGCOG has the authority, under New Mexico State Law, for the comprehensive and functional planning in this region. This Board was created by the MRGCOG, and all of the Rio Puerco and the Rio Jemez are identified as separate sub basins and are not included in the same basin as the Middle Rio Grande. These areas must also be covered in Regional Water Planning. There will be future discussion as to the inclusion of these areas in the Board structure for planning purposes. This Board does not have the power to determine water rights. The purpose of this Board is to plan for the usage of water in this region with the input of it's members withdrew her second. On the action to amend the Bylaws, it was deferred to the next meeting.

8. Regional Water Plan

Mr. Jim Gross, MRGCOG made the announcement that the Interstate Stream Commission has granted permission to proceed with the scope of work for the regional water plan.

Background: The Board of Directors for the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments passed a resolution on June 11, 1998 establishing a Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board and providing authorization and guidance to the Executive Director to initiate a regional water planning work program. Pursuant to this authorization the MRGCOG submitted a with the cooperation and input of the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly. Governing bodies of the local agencies and water providers will choose whether and/or how to implement the Plan. The Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan will look at projected future water demands and evaluate alternatives to supply those demands. The scope of work includes 3 major tasks: (1) Water Demand Study, (2) Public Involvement Program, and (3) Preliminary Alternatives Analysis. The Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly will participate with MRGCOG staff and the Interstate Stream Commission in developing the plan. Contract approvals by all appropriate State agencies are expected in August. Work will commence immediately upon authorization from the Interstate Stream Commission.

<u>Policy Ramifications:</u> The Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan will establish recommended water management alternatives for meeting future water demands. The plan is to be approved by the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board and transmitted to the Interstate Stream Commission for approval. Local agencies and water providers will be responsible for implementing the plan. The plan may also contain recommendations for implementation by State and Federal agencies.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: State funds of \$150,000 from the Interstate Stream Commission will be attached by cash and in-kind contributions from MRGCOG and the Assembly.

9. New or Unfinished Business

There was no discussion under this item.

10. <u>Time and Place of Next Meeting</u>

The next MRGWRB meeting is scheduled for 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, September 8, 1999 at the MRGCOG conference room.

11. Adjournment

The August meeting was adjourned by consensus at 2:05 p.m.

1. Call to Order

The meeting of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) was called to order at 11:55 a.m. on September 8, 1999 by Dennis Foltz, Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments (MRGCOG) Executive Director. A quorum was present.

2. Approval of Agenda

Mr. David Stoliker, Southern Sandoval County Arroyo Flood Control Authority, made a motion to:

APPROVE THE AGENDA AS WRITTEN.

Mr. Larry Webb, City of Rio Rancho, seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

3. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Foltz announced that the MRGCOG Executive Board has agreed to provide lunches for the MRGWRB meetings.

Mr. Foltz explained that at the August Executive Board meeting, he reported to them on the progress of the MRGWRB meetings. The Executive Board appreciates the MRGWRB'S input into the bylaws, but would like the MRGWRB to accept the bylaws as is.

Mr. Foltz explained the name plates to the MRGWRB as grey signifying voting members, yellow as alternates, green as ex-officio members, blue as MRGCOG staff. Those name plates having blue dots identify those members serving on the Water Providers Council.

Mr. Jim Gross, Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments, reported that as of the last meeting two of the three major tasks of the regional water plan have been started: Task One, the Overall Program Management Team (OPMT) met to discuss a procedure for moving forward with the Historical Demand Study; and Task Two, a meeting was held with the Interstate Stream Commission and the State Engineers Web Master to get started on creating a web page. Under Task Three, an organizational meeting will be held on the evening of this meeting, September 8.

4. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

5. Summary of Proceedings For August 11,1999

Mr. Subhas Shah, Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District, requested that under Item 8 Regional Water Plan Paragraph 2, the third sentence be amended to read: "Governing bodies of the local agencies and water providers will choose whether and or how to implement the plan."

Mr. Larry Blair, City of Albuquerque requested that statements he made to the MRGWRB on the Bylaws be placed in the August summaries.

Mr. David Stoliker, Southern Sandoval County Arroyo Flood Control Authority, made a motion to:

APPROVE THE SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS AS AMENDED.

Mr. Larry Webb, City of Rio Rancho, seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

6. <u>Nomination of Officers</u>

Mr. Gross presented a handout explaining the ballot created by the nominating committee for selection of method the Chair and Vice-Chair.

The nominating committee consisting of Ms. Mary Murnane, Bernalillo County; Mr. Stoliker, and Mr. Danny Hernandez, Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority, prepared a list candidates to run for the positions of Chair and Vice Chair for the MRGWRB.

The nominating committee nominated Mr. Hector Gonzales, Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District; Ms. Alicia Aguilar, Valencia County; and Mr. William Sapien, Sandoval County, for the positions of Chair and Vice Chair for the MRGWRB.

The MRGWRB nominated Mr. Frank Faustine, City of Rio Rancho and Mr. Hernandez as Chair and Vice Chair of the MRGWRB.

Mr. Larry Webb, made a motion that:

NOMINATIONS BE CLOSED.

Ms. Aguilar seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Mr. Gonzales withdrew from being nominated for Chair and asked that he be considered for Vice Chair only. He nominated Mr. Blair for Chair.

As a motion to close the nominations had been made and seconded, Mr. Foltz asked whether the maker of the motion and the seconder, would withdraw their motion to allow Mr. Blair's

name to be added to the ballot.

Ms. Aguilar and Mr. Webb both withdrew their motions.

Mr. Richard Jaramillo, City of Belen made a motion to reopen the nominations for Chair and to add Mr. Blair as a candidate for the Chair.

Mr. Gonzales seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Mr. Hernandez moved that nominations be closed.

Mr. Jaramillo seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Ms. Aguilar withdrew her name from being nominated for Chair.

The results were:

Mr. Blair - 7

Mr. Faustine - 1

Mr. Hernandez - 2

Mr. Sapien - 2

Mr. Blair was Elected as Chair of the MRGWRB.

Chairman Blair stated that he would like to establish one rule, that as a courtesy that he would ask that anyone wishing to speak would raise their hand, and the Chair will recognize each speaker.

Chairman Blair asked who the nominees were for Vice Chair. They were identified as: Mr. Sapien, Mr. Gonzales, and Ms. Aguilar.

Chairman Blair called for nominations from the floor for Vice Chair.

Mr. Hernandez, Mr. Jaramillo and Mr. Faustine were nominated to run for Vice Chair.

Mr. Webb made a motion that:

NOMINATIONS BE CLOSED.

Mr. Jaramillo seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Chairman Blair called for a vote for Vice Chair.

The results were:

Ms. Aguilar - 2 Mr. Faustine - 1 Mr. Gonzales - 0 Mr. Hernandez - 0 Mr. Jaramillo - 4 Mr. Sapien - 5

Since no candidate had a majority vote, a runoff was required between Mr. Jaramillo and Mr. Sapien.

The results of the runoff vote for Vice Chair were:

Mr. Jaramillo - 6 Mr. Sapien - 6

Mr. Sapien, stating that he wishes to encourage the young to participate in politics, graciously withdrew from the election. Mr. Jaramillo was selected as the Vice Chair for the MRGWRB.

7. Bylaws

Chairman Blair explained that a copy of the revised Bylaws was included in their packet. The handout below was provided charting the impact of varying the size of the Water Providers Council on the weighted vote percent.

<u>Background:</u> The Interim Bylaws of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board were adopted by the MRGCOG Board of Directors on March 11, 1999. Subsequent to a review by the Water Board a number of suggestions have been made to clarify or amend the Bylaws. The nature of the proposed changes has to do with the organizational structure and the voting procedures. A proposed draft of the Interim Bylaws is attached for consideration by the Water Board.

<u>Policy Ramifications:</u> The membership and decision making process defined by the Bylaws of the Water Board is critical to its function and must be acceptable to the members of the Water Board and the MRGCOG Executive Board.

Financial Impact: None.

After some discussion, Mr. Webb made a motion to:

RECOMMEND TO THE MRGCOG BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT THE AMENDED MRGWRB BYLAWS BE APPROVED AS WRITTEN.

Mr. Sapien seconded the motion.

Mr. Jaramillo seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Ms. Aguilar suggested that all MRGWRB members prepare a list of concerns and submit them to Jim Gross before the next meeting. Copies of these concerns will be distributed at the next meeting.

8. New or Unfinished Business

Mr. Foltz mentioned that Deborah Hibbard, Rio Grande Restoration, had presented a letter requesting that a representative for the Rio Grande River be considered as an Ex-officio member of the MRGWRB. This will be added as a discussion item at the next meeting.

He asked that those members leaving the Board meeting prior to completion of action items fill out a proxy form for those action items remaining on the agenda

2. Approval of Agenda

Action Taken:

Mr. Frank Faustine, City of Rio Rancho, made a motion to:

Board Member Hector Gonzales, Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District, seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

3. Chair's Report

Chair Blair reported that he was a members of a Governor's Blue Ribbon Task Force on State water issues. He offered to take any comments or concerns of the MRGWRB forward to the Task Force as requested.

He noted that a Joint Powers Agreement had been signed between the City of Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, and the Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque which will facilitate the development of water and sewer in the South Valley.

Said designated person **or alternate** shall serve on both the Water Board and the Water Providers Council, when applicable. The Voting status of the Water Board is displayed on a matrix chart attached as Exhibit 3 and made a part of these Interim Bylaws.

It is noted that these changes will be made before finalization and signature by the Board of Directors.

7. Senate Bill 512, 44th NM Legislature, First Session, 1999

New Mexico State Senator Sue Wilson provided a briefing on Senate Bill 512, 44th NM Legislature, First Session, 1999, concerning water banking, water rights, and related issues. She explained that the Bill proposes legislation to facilitate water storage and voluntary water transfers within the State of New Mexico. It amends existing New Mexico water law; creates a water bank and a water bank fund administered by the Interstate Stream Commission; and amends criteria for forfeiture of water rights. This Bill would amend the State water law and potentially impact water management options available within the Middle Rio Grande water planning region. It also provides for an appropriation of \$250,000 from the State general fund to the water bank fund.

8. <u>Middle Rio Grande Water Budget</u>

Dr. Frank Titus, Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly, explained that a team of Specialists from the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly compiled existing information concerning the hydrology of the Middle Rio Grande region and presented it in a pamphlet format that is intended to be read and understood by a broad audience of people interested in the region's water resources. The pamphlet was prepared for, and has been approved by, the Action Committee of the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly. A presentation and opportunity for discussion will be provided at a future Water Board meeting.

9. Regional Water Planning

Noting that the length of this meeting had been rather long, Mr. Jim Gross, MRGCOG, deferred his report to the December meeting.

10. New or Unfinished Business

Mr. Gross reported that at the November 4, 1999 MRGCOG Executive Board meeting, the Board voted to recommend that the suggested changes to the MRGWRB be approved by the MRGCOG Board of Directors at their December 16, 1999 meeting.

He also reported that work is continuing on Tasks 1, 2, and 3 of the Water Plan. A Request for Proposals was issued and the deadline for receiving these proposals is November 12, 1999. There has been a great interest in the Task-2 Work Group by people in the Puerco and Jemez subdivisions with regards to development of the public involvement committees. The Task-3 Work Group has identified an opportunity to possibly work with the University of New Mexico Institute for Public Policy to perform a public survey called for under the scope of work.

Commissioner Sapien suggested that at future MRGWRB meetings, with regards to Discussion and Information Items, presenters be requested to limit their presentation to ten minutes, allowing for an additional five minutes for questions. It was also suggested that should a subject need a much longer time for presentation and discussion, a special work study session could be held to address the issue.

4. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Jim Gross, MRGCOG staff, reported:

- There are approximately 16 different legislative proposals for water that may be introduced during the 2000 Legislative Session:
 - Domestic Well Proposal (targeted toward municipalities)
 - Authorization of Water Court Divisions (within 3 judicial districts)
 - Changing the definition of Beneficial Use in State Law to include conservation
 - Establish a Water Trust Fund with revenues to be derived from severance taxes
 - Water Banking
 - Proposal to do some research and development on Industrial Hemp Production in the State of New Mexico
- The National Association of Office and Industrial Parks association has formed a Water Task Force and invited Mr. Gross to participate. They will be developing some policy statements related to upcoming legislation, as well as looking at long range policy statements related to water use in the region.

3. Chair's Report

Chairman Blair noted that:

- Federal Water Resources Development Act recently passed by Congress includes Section 593 that provides Bernalillo, Sandoval, Valencia Counties assistance through the Corps of Engineers.
- The authorized funding is for: design and construction assistance for related environmental infrastructure and resource protection; wastewater and conservation; and surface water projects in these three counties.
- One requirement is that these projects must be publicly owned project.
- There is \$25 million authorized in this section for fiscal year 2000 until expended.
- Copies were provided to the Board Members as a HANDOUT.
- Joint regional projects would have a much better chance of having funds appropriated to the region.
- The Governor's Blue Ribbon Water issue Task Force has recommended that the Governor's office hire a person to deal with water issues in the State.

4. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Dennis Foltz, MRGCOG Executive Director, noted that:

- The Middle Rio Grande water planning reion contains the Middle Rio Grande Basin, the Jemez Basin, and the Rio Puerco Basin.
- The Middle Rio Grande Water Resource Board (MRGWRB) has been established to develop a water plan for the Middle Rio Grande Basin.

- The MRGCOG will be assisting in the development of a water plan for both the Jemez and Rio Puerco basins.
- Representatives are being sought from both the Rio Jemez and Rio Puerco areas to serve on the MRGWRB as ex-officio members.
- This will provide communication and coordination between the three planning efforts.

Mr. Jim Gross, MRGCOG staff, reported: Legislative Update –

• <u>Background:</u> There was a rather lengthy list of bills and capital requests dealing with water in this year's legislative session. Many did not have any direct impact to water planning in the Middle Rio Grande region. Of particular significance is Senate Capital Outlay Request 66 (SC66), sponsored by Senator Pauline B. Eisenstadt, requesting one million dollars for the continuation of regional water planning in New Mexico. No status on the request was available at the time of the agenda mailing.

<u>Policy Ramifications:</u> It may be more difficult to complete a State Water Plan without support to develop and complete regional water plans.

<u>Financial Impact:</u> The Middle Rio Grande Water Planning region currently has an award of \$150,000 from the Interstate Stream Commission for water planning. If this legislation does not pass, local governments will need to rely on other sources of revenue for regional water planning.

- A contract has be let with John Shomaker and Associates, Inc. as part of Task 1 of the Water Planning project. The contract is for historical and current water demand in the planning region and a report should be available in April 2000.
- The Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly's 4th Assembly for Water Planning in the Middle Rio Grande is scheduled for Saturday, March 25, 2000, 9-4:30 pm. The conference will be held in the Anthropology Lecture Hall on the University of New Mexico Campus. Lunch will be provided: \$5 early registration or \$10 at the door.

Proposed Water Program for Fiscal Year 2000-01-

• <u>Background:</u> Water planning for the Middle Rio Grande Region was started in fiscal year 1999-2000. It is anticipated that it will take approximately 3 years to complete the initial plan. The proposed program for the second year includes a continuation of work for the public involvement program and alternatives development. Additional work to clarify future water demand is also anticipated.

Policy Ramifications: None

<u>Financial Impact:</u> Level funding is dependent upon whether continued funding will be available from the State through the Interstate Stream Commission.

An outline of a proposed program for FY 2000/2001 was provided as an attachment.

Discussion and questions included by the MRGWRB members included:

- It had been discussed earlier that the MRGCOG might set up a mechanism for additional revenue through some type of membership assessment.
 - For the first year of the program, the MRGCOG Board agreed to provide a portion of the match to the Interstate Stream Commission monies.
 - For the second year of the program, it would be appropriate to have the discussion on some type of member assessment to support the program.
- It was suggested that a potential budget be presented at the next MRGWRB meeting as well a two or three scenarios for funding formulas.
 - The second year program could potentially need \$200,000. The level of funding will depend on the Interstate Stream Commission money.
- There is concern by members of the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly that there was not enough left over from the first year Interstate Stream Commission contract to accomplish the tasks assigned to the Assembly.
- The Assembly may have to seek other funding to accomplish their tasks.
- Some members of the Assembly may not understand the nature of the Interstate Stream Commission contract and how the funding is to be used.
- The original proposal for the Middle Rio Grande Water Plan was for \$750,000 funding with a \$750,000 match.
- What was received was \$150,000 with a hard and soft match.
- The MRGCOG has moved forward with the planning effort at a high effort.
- It would be beneficial to compare the proposed tasks of the Water Planning effort to the Interstate Stream Commission's template.
- By identifying what the MRGWRB, Assembly, and MRGCOG staff tasks are and how they relate to the template will provide a "yard stick" on what are our accomplishments and what are the gaps.
- If the local member governments will have to support the water planning effort, would the additional needed funding be a special assessment or would it be part of the normal dues.
 - As the current membership dues support all of the current programs and the
 water program was not considered as part of those programs, it is anticipated
 that there would be the need for a special assessment to support the water
 program.
- It was requested that a matrix be prepared outlining the roles and responsibilities related to the tasks of the MRGCOG staff and the Assembly.

7. Middle Rio Grande Water Plan FY 2001 Program and Budget Alternatives

Background: The Board of Directors for the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments authorized the initiation of a regional water planning program in 1998. The Director of Water Planning was hired in June of 1999, and a contract for regional water planning was executed with the Interstate Stream Commission in August 1999. Cash funding support for the program for the first year (Aug. 1999 - July 2000) is approximately \$200,000, of which approximately \$150,000 is coming from the Interstate Stream Commission. In-kind services from the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments and the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly are also being provided to support the project.

State funding of regional water planning in fiscal year 2001 does not appear to be possible at this time because it is not in the current budget that was sent to the Governor. It appears probable that the costs for continuation of the water planning program in fiscal year 2001, at least initially, will have to be born by local governments.

Three levels of funding are presented for review and discussion. The base-case level (\$200,000 per year) represents approximately the current level of project funding, and the schedule to initial plan completion is anticipated to be 3 to 4 years as originally scheduled. The highest level of support shown (\$300,000 per year) represents an increase in effort above the current level. The time to complete the initial plan is remains 3 to 4 years; however, the plan would include a greater level of detail and there would be a larger public involvement program. The lowest level (\$150,000 per year) represents a base-level maintenance level of funding. The project schedule to an initial plan is estimated to 4 to 5 years for this level of support.

<u>Policy Ramifications</u>: No major policy ramifications for the funding alternatives presented.

Financial Impact: Dependent upon the level of funding support.

Discussion and questions included:

- The materials presented did not present a clear and concise picture of the three alternatives
- Budget considerations by the local governments is already underway for Fiscal Year 2001
- The tasks and the sub-tasks of the full water program should be presented along with associated costs
- A flow chart of the relationship and responsibilities of the Water Assembly and the MRGCOG should be prepared
- The contract with ISC has a several major tasks that have yet to be accomplished
- In order to convince the local governments to fund this program, there has to be full justification on what the water planning program will accomplish and what will the benefit be to the local governments

- The Water Resource Development Act funding is that the 75/25 match is for the Corps of Engineers to do the work, if this is being considered, it would most likely be a contractual effort
- Has the MRGCOG done any "bench marking" with the other water basin planning efforts in the State?
 - There are several regions in the State that did not receive funding and their water programs are not moving forward.
 - Has ISC decided if it will allocate the reserves from the State allocation?
 - Response: ISC kept \$1 million for administration and other studies
- The MRGWRB needs to establish its own role in the water planning process.
- The MRGWRB needs to be involved with the development of the work program
- What does the MRGWRB ultimately want from this process. Once that is established, work it back in to a timetable and deliverables
- How can we best get the results either using staff or consultants.
- That before funding levels could be recommended to the MRGCOG Board of Directors, the products of the Water Plan should be identified and prioritized
- The MRGCOG Board of Directors will meet on April 13th and a recommendation from the MRGWRB should move forward to them
- There are 21 voting members, 33 votes on the Water Providers, if the needed funding is divided by evenly by the votes on the MRGWRB, each member would pay approximately \$7,500 each. If you take the votes on the Water Providers Council, then the MRGCD and the City of Albuquerque would pick up about half of the cost of the program.
- Many local governments are facing their own reduced budgets, and if the additional funding needs for the Water Program are too much, some local governments may have to walk away from the program this coming year.

6. <u>Middle Rio Grande Water Plan FY 2001 Program</u>

Background: The Board of Directors for the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments authorized the initiation of a regional water planning program in 1998. The Director of Water Planning was hired in June of 1999, and a contract for regional water planning was executed with the Interstate Stream Commission in August 1999. Cash funding support for the program for the first year (August 1999 - July 2000) is approximately \$2001000 of which approximately \$150,000 is coming from the Interstate Stream Commission (ISC). In-kind services from the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments (MRGCOG) and the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly are also being provided to support the project.

State funding of regional water planning in fiscal year 2001 does not appear to be likely at this time. Continuation of the regional water planning program in fiscal year 2001 may need to rely more on funding from local governments in the water planning region.

Three levels of funding were presented at the Water Board meeting of March 8, 2000. Generalized differences in the project schedule and level

of effort were discussed by staff and Board members. Water Board members requested additional information concerning the goals, objectives, and scope of work for the regional water planning program. Subsequent to the Water Board meeting on March 8th, a special committee of the MRGCOG Board was convened and considered more detailed information concerning funding alternatives and the potential work programs associated with different levels of funding. The Special Committee directed MRGCOG staff to develop methods of funding for a program of approximately \$265,000 per year with no increase in staff effort.

Policy Ramifications: No major policy ramifications for the funding alternatives presented.

Financial Impact: Dependent upon the level of funding support.

A HANDOUT was provided to the Board that included: The Regional Water Planning Template; Summary of Major Tasks, Projected Expenses for the 2nd and 3rd years of the project; Average Annual Costs for the 2nd and 3rd years of the project; Potential FY 2001 Funding Alternatives; and the Major Work Responsibilities of MRGCOG staff.

Discussion and comments included:

- The MRGCOG Water Plan Task Force recommended Table 2 of the HANDOUT as the recommended funding alternative for FY 2001.
- The MRGCOG staff was directed to request the suggested funding from the participating local governments for FY 2001 with the understanding that all the members may be unable to participate

- That \$150,000 that will support a "bare-bones" program through FY 2001
- Request for additional funding would have to be made before the local or special units of government
- Chair Blair offered to participate in presentations to the local or special units of government
- The MRGCD Char, Lawrence Troncosa, will not support this additional funding as Socorro County and the 6 Pueblos are not involved in the process
- It was suggested that material be developed that presents the long term benefit for each community within the water planning region
- It was suggested that a compromise be developed between Table 2 and Table 4 of the HANDOUT.
- A local government could not afford a study such as the one being proposed for the costs. A single consultant study would be much more.
- The presentation should include talking points that include:
 - The Interstate Stream Commission has mandated water planning for the State
 - A water plan could protect the local governments from outside entities trying to obtain water
 - The Texas Legislature recently appropriate major funding to a project to find water outside of their State.
 - The planning process for the Water Program is based on the highly successful Transportation Program
 - The major difference is that Transportation is Federal funded
 - This region has to plan for future water use and protection of those valuable resources

- Funding will always be uncertain, therefore, the local governments will have to support the program
- The City of Albuquerque has committed \$50,000 in the current budget and \$50,000 in FY 2001
- The City of Rio Rancho has budgeted some funds for the program.
- Everyone should contribute to the program. However, because budget processes have started, it may not be possible.
- It was noted that Socorro County was invited to participate in the Regional Water Planning process and they declined the offer.
- The MRGWRB should spend more time on anticipated work tasks for the next two years for the Regional Water Plan.
- It was noted that an HANDOUT had been provided that addressed the ISC Template and the Regional Plan Work Tasks.
- Smaller local governments have lost water resources in other parts of the country without cooperative planning projects

The August 09, 2000 Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) meeting was called to order at 11:59 a.m. by Chair Larry Blair, City of Albuquerque. Chair Blair noted the presence of a quorum. He asked that those members leaving the Board meeting prior to completion of action items fill out a proxy form for those action items remaining on the agenda.

2. Chair's Report:

Chair Blair reported:

- Report from Water Providers Council.
 - Mr. Subhas Shah reported that the meeting was deferred due to lack of a quorum.
- Letter from Pueblo Coalition.

Herb Becker, Water Rights Consultant for the Coalition of Pueblos responded to the June 28th letter that was sent to Mr. John Vincent Avila. Mr. Becker said the letter of invitation to the pueblos will be presented at the August 11th Pueblo Coalition meeting. Following that meeting, we will be provided with the Pueblo Coalition's position.

3. Executive Director's Report:

Mr. Dennis Foltz, MRGCOG, Executive Director, reported on the following:

- Funds available for Fiscal Year 2001 Work Program.
- Tribal Membership.
- Community Conversations.

4. Public Comment:

There was public comment from Deborah Hibbard, Rio Grande Restoration on Agenda Items 7, 8, and 9. Ms. Hibbard indicated that the Rio Grande should have a representative on the Water Resources Board, and requested the Water Resources Board to recommend expanding its membership to include such representative. Ms. Hibbard recommended that Dr. Cliff Crawford be considered as that representative.

5. Approval of the Agenda:

<u>Action taken</u>: Mr. Danny Hernandez, Board Member made the motion to:

MOVE ITEM 10 TO ITEM 8 AND RENUMBER THE AGENDA ACCORDINGLY.

The motion was seconded by Chair Blair and carried unanimously.

6. Approval of Summary of Proceedings:

<u>Action taken</u>: Mary Murnane, Planner, Bernalillo made the motion to:

AMEND THE JULY 12, 2000 SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS BY ADDING BULLET 6 IN SECTION 15., PAGE 4, FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS: TMDL'S PHASE II REGULATIONS AND ARSENIC.

The motion was seconded by Danny Hernandez, Board Member, and carried unanimously.

7. Recommendation of an amendment to the Bylaws to the MRGCOG Board of Directors:

Background: The chairman of the Water Resources Board requested that a committee develop recommendations concerning ex-officio and advisory membership in the Water Resources Board. Ms. Mary Murnane presented an oral report and handout to the Water Resources Board at the meeting on July 12, 2000. The report recommended extending advisory membership to various state and federal agencies who might be able to assist the Water Resources Board concerning technical information and policy positions of their respective agencies. Such agencies were identified to include but not limited to: (1) the Office of the State Engineer/Interstate Stream Commission, (2) the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, (3) the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and (3) the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

<u>Policy Ramifications</u>: Potential changes to the bylaws of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board concerning categories of membership.

Financial Impact: None.

Discussions and Comments included:

- Mr. Dennis Foltz presented proposed sections to the bylaws of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board Article 2 (Authority), addition of section C, concerning the establishment of committees, and Article 3 (Organization and Membership), addition of section E, concerning advisory membership positions.
- Ms. Mary Murnane expressed concern about advisory memberships.
- Mr. Edward Richardson, Representative, Village of Corrales, expressed concern about the bylaws handout as not being part of Item 7.
- Mr. Dennis Foltz clarified that the revised bylaws will be presented as a handout to the MRG Board of Directors at the October meeting.
- Ms Hibbard expressed concern that the Rio Grande River wasn't voiced.
 She recommended that Dr. Cliff Crawford, Biology Professor, University of New Mexico, would adequately represent the "River's" voice. Dr. Crawford is an active member of the Bosque Consortium.

- Mr. Hernandez made a recommendation that the last sentence of section E
 be revised and read "Advisory membership shall be non-voting and will
 include members which the Water Board considers qualified to make an
 effective contribution to the Board."
- Chair Blair made a suggestion that the first sentence of Section E read "Advisory membership positions may be established on the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board."
- Chair Blair stated that the language be agreed upon and revised at this
 meeting for both sections of the amendment and sent out for next month's
 agenda packets and will be voted on then.

Action taken:

Mr. Edward Richardson, Representative, Village of Corrales,

made the motion to:

DEFER ITEM 7 TILL THE NEXT MEETING.

Mr. William Sapien, Commissioner, Sandoval County, seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

8. Public Survey on Water Issues by the Institute for Public Policy:

Mr. John Brown, Project Manager, Institute for Public Policy presented a report on "Public Perceptions, Values and Policy Preferences About Water Issues in New Mexico and the Middle Rio Grande Region."

<u>Background</u>: The Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments and the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly cooperated with the Institute for Public Policy (IPP) at the University of New Mexico to develop a telephone survey concerning water issues. The survey was conducted in conjunction with IPP's statewide spring survey. The survey was conducted in March and April 2000. The final report on the results of the survey was completed in June 2000.

<u>Policy Ramifications</u>: Consideration by the Water Resources Board of public values, attitudes, and preferences concerning water in the development and approval of a regional water plan.

Financial Impact: None.

Discussion and comments included:

 Mr. Shah questioned how Mr. Brown got his response results from full-time farmer's within Bernalillo County.

Response: Mr. Brown replied that the survey was based on a random sample of people from the State of New Mexico and the Middle Rio Grande Region.

9. Update Status of Litigation Water Issues:

Ms. Eileen Grevey-Hillson, Representative, National Association Industrial and Office Properties (NAIOP) made a verbal report on the status of water litigation.

Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District vs. Babbitt Minnow vs. Martinez

Discussion and comments included:

- Ms. Woodard questioned who comprised the membership of NAIOP and who was NAIOP's attorney for water litigation. Response: Ms. Hillson stated that their water lawyer for the water litigation cases is Mr. Tim D. Young and Maria O'Brian from the law firm of Modrall, Sperling, Roehl, Harris & Sisk. NAIOP membership is from representatives of real estate development communities; architects, engineers, real estate attorneys, title companies, banks, 1000 Friends of New Mexico, and any person who is interested in real estate and land use issues.
- Mr. Hernandez asked if NAIOP had done anything to help secure funding from the Interstate Stream Commission, (ISC) for regional water planning. Response: Ms. Hillson stated that she had a personal meeting with Frank Sanchez during the last legislative session regarding funding for regional water planning.
- Mr. Lee Brown, Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly, asked if the NAIOP Water Policy statement will be available.
 Response: Ms. Hillson stated that the NAIOP policy has been completed and has been approved by the board and will be publicly available.
- Mr. Bob Wessely, Friends of Placitas commented that domestic immigration is greater than the birth rate.

10. <u>Conservancy District's New Water Use Information:</u>

Mr. Subhas Shah, Chief Engineer, Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District presented his "MRGCD Diversion and Return Flows" handout.

Discussion and comments included:

- Mr. John Stomp, City of Albuquerque questioned whether the Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District System Water Use was diversion or consumptive use.
 - Response: Mr. Shah stated that it is consumptive use of 2.54 acre-feet of water per acre.
- Mr. Stomp stated that 175,900 acre feet of water has been dedicated to keep for the Minnows. It is 3, 4 or 5 times the amount the City of Albuquerque uses in a year and more than the MRGCD's uses. It is 33 miles of water on top of one acre of land that is being used for the minnows.

11. Monthly Committee Schedule:

The Monthly Committee Schedule was presented as attachment D.

- Mr. Hernandez stated that it was agreed from the last meeting that MRGCOG staff insert "Report from the Water Assembly" as a regular information item on the agenda.

1. Call to Order:

The September 13, 2000 Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) meeting was called to order at 11:58 a.m. by Vice Chair Richard Jaramillo, City of Belen. Vice Chair Jaramillo noted the presence of a quorum. He asked that those members leaving the Board meeting prior to completion of action items fill out a proxy form for those action items remaining on the agenda.

2. Chair's Report:

Vice Chair Jaramillo introduced Commissioner Bob Grant, Interstate Stream Commission (ISC), Mr. Norm Gaume and Ms. Mary Helen Follingstad, ISC staff. Vice Chair Jaramillo noted that Mr. Gaume had to leave early and would like to address the members of the MRGWRB under the Chair's Report.

Mr. Gaume made the following comments:

- There is a contract between the ISC and the MRGCOG
- Regional water planning is an extremely difficult task
- The MRGWRB needs to take ownership in the development of a regional water plan for the Middle Rio Grande valley
- The ISC has defined 5 questions that need to be addressed in a regional water plan:
 - 1) What is the water supply?
 - 2) What is the demand for water?
 - 3) What are the alternatives to use that water supply and to meet the demand? (This is not a water rights question, it is a "wet" water question.)
 - 4) What are the relative pros and cons of the alternatives?
 - 5) What is the best alternative and how will it be implemented?
- The ISC received a \$150,000 appropriation which was matched by the Corps of Engineers to study the question of water supply
- A draft report will be available at the end of the month
- Chair Larry Blair, MRGWRB and Chair Lee Brown, Water Assembly, described the outcome of this draft study accurately in their Op-ed piece
- Increased demands on the aquifer will make the water supply inadequate to meet further demands
- The ISC/MRGCOG contract elements are:
 - the water demand question will be answered
 - preliminary alternatives will be developed
 - public involvement will be conducted
- In his opinion, the Water Assembly is the best entity to conduct the public involvement process for the regional water plan
- The region is in danger of Federal intervention in local water decisions

Current litigation in the region is serious

- The regional water plan will assist in the preservation of future water resources in the valley
- It is important that we make progress in developing the regional water plan as quickly as possible

7. Recommendation for Amendments to the Bylaws for the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board

Background: At the meeting of the Water Resources Board on December 8, 1999, Chairman Larry Blair appointed a committee to make recommendations concerning ex officio membership for the Water Resources Board. At the meeting of the Water Resources Board on June 14, 2000, Chairman Blair requested this same committee to prepare recommendations concerning advisory membership positions on the Water Resources Board. This committee reported back to the Water Resources Board at the meeting on July 12, 2000 with recommendations of potential advisory membership positions for certain federal and state agencies that could assist the Water Resources Board with technical and policy issues.

Proposed revisions to the bylaws of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board concerning advisory membership positions were discussed at the Water Resources Board meeting on August 9, 2000. There was also discussion about the formation of committees to assist the Water Resources Board in developing the regional water plan, and Chairman Blair requested Mr. Subhas Shah, the chairman of the Water Providers Council, to nominate an ad hoc water technical committee. Chairman Blair directed staff to incorporate the comments from the August 9th meeting concerning potential bylaws revisions dealing with advisory membership and committees for discussion at the meeting of the Water Resources Board on September 13, 2000.

<u>Policy Ramifications</u>: Potential recommendations for changes to the bylaws of the Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board concerning (1) advisory membership positions on the Water Resources Board, and (2) the establishment of committees.

Financial Impact: None

- Clarification needs to be included in the amendment to Article 3(E) as to who
 makes the appointment of the advisory members
- The language in the amendment does not reflect the recommendation of the Ex-Officio Subcommittee that advisory and ex-officio membership should be limited to water management agencies
- The amendment clearly states that these positions are "non-voting" and "make an effective contribution"
- The Water Assembly would have a serious concern if advisory membership was offered to non-governmental agencies

9. <u>Draft 2001 Legislative Policies</u>

Background:

The full board of the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments establishes legislative priorities each year to transmit to the New Mexico legislature. Draft policy statements are attached for review and discussion by the MRGWRB members.

Policy Ramifications:

Agency positions concerning legislative priorities for water and water planning.

Financial Impact:

May impact availability of funding from the State legislature.

Discussion and Comments included:

- The MRGCOG Board will adopt their 2001 Legislative Policies at their December 14, 2000.
- Recommendations by the MRGWRB will be needed at their November meeting.
- It was noted that the first item, support for additional funding, is imperative.
- If additional funding is not provided, the regional water planning efforts will fall behind.
- The MRGWRB members should approach their respective jurisdictions to articulate the funding needs and to include the same priorities in their respective policies to bring to the Legislature.
- NM Dialogue will host a state-wide meeting at MRGCOG on October 25th for all of the water planning regions.
- It would assist members of the MRGWRB in discussions with Legislators if they had a list of deliverables for the regional water planning process.
- Water Budget and the Water Resource Planning documents can be used in these discussions and need to be reviewed by the Board members.
- It was suggested that the Ad Hoc Technical Committee review these policies and review and recommend additional policies for the MRGWRB consideration at their next meeting.
- MRGWRB members are encouraged to forward additional suggestions to Mr. Jim Gross, MRGCOG staff.

10.A. Regional Water Planning Goals and Objectives Schedule

Mr. Gross discussed the schedule for approval of the Regional Water Planning Program Goals and Objectives. Currently, the Goals Forum will be held on November 4, 2000 at the Albuquerque Convention Center. During November, three meeting will be held on Preliminary Alternatives. The schedule calls for the MRGWRB to review the draft Goals and Objectives at their November 8th

meeting, with a public hearing scheduled for December 13th at 6:00 pm. Mr. Gross requested guidance from the members of the MRGWRB as to whether or not this schedule was too ambitious, or should the schedule be extended for the public hearing in January or February.

Discussion and Comments included:

- It was noted that the original schedule was to have the Goals and Objectives available for the Legislative Session to encourage additional funding for planning
- The background paper produced for the Community Conversations was also a good tool for use with the Legislature.
- It was the consensus of the MRGWRB that the Regional Water Planning Goals and Objectives process remain on the current schedule.

10.B. Report from the Water Assembly

- Series on Saving Water in the Desert beginning every third Wednesday of the month, at 5:30 pm, US Department of Agriculture Building 6200 Jefferson NE
- Encouraged participation by the members of the MRGWRB in the Regional Water Forum, November 4, Albuquerque Convention Center
- Requested permission to advertise that the Forum is a joint sponsored event between the Water Assembly and the MRGWRB
 - Response: The MRGWRB agreed to be a co-sponsor

The following were INFORMATION ITEMS, no action was taken by the Board.

11. Roles and responsibilities of the MRGCOG/MRGWRB and the Water Assembly Background:

The contract between Interstate Stream Commission (ISC) and MRGCOG was executed on August 1, 1999 and included an initial term of 12 months. Contract deliverables were not completed at the end of the initial 12 months of the contract. Ms. Mary Helen Follingstad and Mr. Gross of the Interstate Stream Commission worked together in July 2000 to develop a contract amendment extending the contract end date. Documents for amendment number one to the contract were executed by MRGCOG and transmitted to the ISC on August 4, 2000.

A meeting was held on Wednesday, August 23, 2000 to review the progress of developing the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan. Mr. Noman Gaume of the ISC indicated that: (1) he would extend the existing contract to November 1, 2000, and (2) he wanted to set a clearer definition of the roles and responsibilities of the MRGWRB, MRGCOG staff, and the Water Assembly in developing the regional water plan before extending the contract period beyond November 1, 2000.

Chairman Larry Blair, Mr. Lee Brown, Chairman, Water Assembly, and Mr. Dennis Foltz held a series of meetings in September 2000 to evaluate: (1) the work products remaining to be completed under the ISC contract, (2) the responsibilities of the parties in completing the work, (3) the level of effort and resources to be dedicated in completing the work, and (4) the timeframe for completing the work. These meeting resulted in an agreement among the parties that is documented in two memorandums (dated September 21 and 29, 2000) from Mr. Brown to Chairman Blair and Mr. Foltz and in a letter to Norman Guame (date October 4, 2000) from Chairman Blair, Mr. Brown, and Mr. Foltz that summarizes the agreement that was reached concerning these issues.

Possibility for additional funds to be raised by the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly to be dedicated towards regional water plan work products.

12. Community Conversations Report

The November 8, 2000 Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) meeting was called to order at 11:55 a.m. by Chairman Larry Blair, City of Albuquerque. Chairman Blair noted the presence of a quorum. He asked that those members leaving the MRGWRB meeting prior to completion of action items fill out a proxy form for those action items remaining on the agenda.

2. Chair's Report:

- Chair Blair encouraged all members to attend the Water Assembly Action Committee meetings. There will be a meeting on November 15, the topic will be on agriculture.
- Chairman Blair attended the Water & Natural Resources Interim committee
 meeting in Deming. One of the presenters encouraged adequate funding
 for the State Engineers Office and for regional water planning. The
 consensus was that most of the lobbying for increased funding will have to
 be done by the individual planning districts and not by the Interstate Stream
 Commission (ISC).
- Chairman Blair encouraged members to call respective legislators and encourage them to provide adequate funding this year for regional water planning.
- Chairman Blair attended a meeting of the Governor's Blue Ribbon Task
 Force on water. A few key points that were adopted were funding for the
 State Engineer's Office and regional water planning, a recommendation that
 the legislature establish a water trust fund, and support for increased effort
 on the domestic well issues.
- An ISC handout was reviewed regarding the status of regional water planning efforts throughout New Mexico.
- The comment period for the total maximum daily load program should be turned in to the New Mexico Environmental Department by Friday, November 10th.
- Attachments A was reviewed regarding funding for the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan. Chairman Blair noted receipt of a letter from the Governor of Isleta Pueblo, withdrawing participation from the WRB.
- A draft letter was recommended to be sent to the Governor of Isleta Pueblo.
- The ISC is negotiating with the Coalition of six pueblos to provide them funding for regional water planning.

1. Call to Order:

The December 13, 2000 Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Chairman Larry Blair, City of Albuquerque. Chairman Blair noted the presence of a quorum.

2. Chair's Report:

- Chairman Blair reported that Dennis Foltz had resigned as MRGCOG's Executive Director
- Mr. Fabrizio Bertoletti, City of Albuquerque and Mr. Chris Blewett, Bernalillo County have been designated as Co-acting directors.
- Mr. Bertoletti stated that he looked forward to working with the MRGWRB and hoped to assist in any way possible.
- Letters were included as attachments from Marion Woolf, Hal Engle and Peter Maggiore.

3. Executive Director's Report:

- Mr. Jim Gross, MRGCOG staff, reported that funding for the next fiscal year from the Interstate Stream Commission (ISC) is looking more optimistic than last year at this time. There seems to be a broad support for a general amount of one and half million for regional water planning statewide. There is current discussion on how to introduce this to the Legislature.
- State funding needed to carry us over through the next two years will be supported by the ISC and possibly by Governor's Blue Ribbon Task Force on Water and the Interim Committee for Water and Natural Resources.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Danny Hernandez, AMAFCA, and carried unanimously.

6. Approval of Summary of Proceedings:

<u>Action taken</u>: Betty Behrend, Village of Los Lunas, made the motion to:

APPROVE THE NOVEMBER 8, 2000 SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS AS WRITTEN.

The motion was seconded by Mr. David Stoliker, SSCAFCA, and was carried unanimously.

7. <u>Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan-Draft Goals and Objectives - Adopt Interim Goals and Objectives</u>

Mr. Gross noted that this meeting was to receive input from the public, secondly, the MRGWRB discuss the Goals and Objectives; and finally, take action if the Board is ready to do that. The Goals and Objectives are important as the cornerstone for the development of the water plan. Goals and Objectives establish stronger credibility with the public through the planning process and help the Board be more aware of public concerns and opinions. Mr. Bob Wessely, Water Assembly, who has contributed many hours in this process, briefed the Board on the process used to develop the goals and objectives.

Discussion and Comments:

Ms. Jean Brochlebank:

- For the record, asked the board to ignore the bad comments regarding living things of the river. She also asked the Board not to pass this resolution based on the draft.
- In the draft, using "ecosystem" is not biologically scientifically correct.
- Under A2: The term "holistic" has no basis on science.
- Under A5: The law of the land is the endangered species act, therefore, we don't decide in New Mexico to meet the needs of endangered species.
- She suggested that regarding the law, it should say comply with the laws that affect Rio Grande: federal, state, and local laws; then list them.

Mr. Michael Lewis:

- Stated that the overall mission is a broad issue.
- Goals are more specific and thinks they will really work and need to be achievable.
- Objectives need to be more specific and measurable. Some of the objectives are really goals. In the education section, an objective started out saying "The goals are", so it needs more review.
- Many of the objectives underneath the goals are repetitive.
- Public comment language has been changed without their knowledge and input and also feels more public comments are needed.
- Michael and Jean stated that they would take the time to go point by point and give their reasoning and suggestions and report back to the WRB.

Ms. Jacqueline Guilbault, Valley Improvement Association:

- Did not receive the draft goals and objectives in the mail.
- Under C1: suggested the term "economic development" be removed and be placed somewhere else.
- Under F4: what is meant by recharge? Is it talking about the rivers or any land area where the rain water falls is considered recharge?
- Feels there needs to be more public involvement. The public did not receive enough information or notification.

Mr. Dale Jones, Valencia County:

Suggested that the local groups have contributed their input in the last two
meeting and currently do not know what is currently going on. The draft
should be taken back to them. It would be worthwhile.

Mr. Andy Smith, Community Water Study Group:

- Stated two major items have not been included: First, is a need for a major pricing reform in Albuquerque which would encourage conservation.
 Second, there is a need to ensure there is no damage to the aquifer.
- There needs to be more study on this issue.

Ms. Joanne McEntire:

- Suggested that there should be a cover letter regarding what objectives are.
- Word smith the objectives and avoid redundancies.
- Recommended to move the goals and objectives under G and make them goals and objectives under A because because G is about the process, the civic engagement in this process, and the implementation process.
- In many planning documents, if it makes this involvement a goal, this will
 be looked at first because it says to the citizens right away that not only are
 they listened to but will continue to do so.

Mr. Kevin Bean, Water Assembly

 Commented on the goals and objectives being the voice of the public and not of the Water Assembly and have the documents of these voices to back them up.

Mr. Bob Wessely presented some background context of the draft goals and objectives. Discussion from the MRGWRB followed public comments:

- The schedule for the Regional Water Plan is to be completed by the end
- of 2003.
- Chairman Blair explained what "recharge" is. A report was produced a few

- years ago and it identified a substantial number of aquifer recharge areas where there was potential high recharge, for example, the foothills is one of those.
- It was also stated that no action would take place at this moment, a special meeting regarding these will be held on January 10, 2001 at 11:30 a.m.
- There is no urgent need to produce a product for the purposes of the ISC.
- It is very important for the goals and objectives to be worded right.
- From an urban perspective, there are many goals but there is not a goal that addresses the needs of the people.
- The regions agriculture should be preserved.
- The goals and objectives should be precise and measurable.
- Under B2: it says historically and culturally, and should include agriculture.
- Throughout the draft, there is no continuity and should be more specific.
- In terms of the process, there are no names on the public comments, and it would have more validity in the process.
- The goals and objectives should start with a mission and a goal.
- This forms the basis for ensuring that everything is considered as we develop a regional water plan, that all public input be addressed fairly.
- Funding needs to be promoted with the Legislature.
- It was suggested that the Assembly give definitions of terms used in the draft before the WRB give back comments.
- Public's input should not be altered.
- It was suggested to hold a workshop.

Mr. Gross in terms of the Scope of Work with the ISC, that the document is a statement of goals and objectives that reflect what the public values. The intent by the Assembly and MRGCOG is that not to let any of the comments made by the public disappear. They will be incorporated into the plan. The Ad Hoc Technical Committee will have their comments also.

Chairman Blair suggested that another set of goals and objectives with a cover letter that asks people to focus on some aspect by a certain time and set a time line on how to proceed. Board members will be asked for their comments by January 8th. A workshop will be held as a separate meeting on January 10, 2001 at 11:30 a.m. Chairman Blair, Chair Lee Brown, Water Assembly and Mr. Gross will meet to draft a cover letter.

8. <u>Draft Legislative Policies</u>:

Background:

The Board of Directors of the Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments establishes legislative policies each year to transmit to the New Mexico legislature. The Board is scheduled to adopt legislative policies at its meeting on

December 14, 2000. Below are the legislative policies that the Board will consider concerning water.

Policy: Support additional funding for statewide regional water planning administered through the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission, and support a legislative appropriation of \$450,000 for completion of the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan

Background:

Since 1988, the New Mexico Legislature has been providing funds on an annual basis to qualified regional water planning agencies. Significant work has been done statewide and the funding program needs to continue in order to complete the regional water plans and provide the basis for a State Water Plan. The Middle Rio Grande Council of Governments and the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly have estimated that the cost to complete the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan is approximately \$900,000. Half of this amount is recommended to be funded by legislative appropriation.

Policy: Support legislation that would facilitate water conservation within the State of New Mexico

Background:

Recent experience with drought conditions in New Mexico has underscored the importance of promoting water conservation measures. However, under current State law, water rights associated with water that is not put to beneficial use are subject to forfeiture. The "use it or lose it" provisions in State law do not encourage conservation or wise use of water. Legislation to promote water conservation while protecting water rights is needed.

Policy Ramifications:

Agency positions concerning legislative priorities for water and water planning.

Financial Impact:

May positively impact availability of funding from the State legislature for regional water planning.

Background:

The MRGCOG established a regional water planning program in 1998, and began work on developing a regional water plan in 1999. The Interstate Stream Commission is providing partial funding for this program, but will not provide all of the funding needed to complete the plan. MRGCOG staff recommends that the members of the Water Resources Board continue providing funding for the regional water planning program at the levels approved by the MRGCOG Board of Directors for fiscal year 2001. A more detailed report laying out the project schedule, work program components, and funding request is attached.

Policy Ramifications:

Continued funding allows MRGCOG to keep the regional water planning program going and to work toward the completion of the regional water plan.

Financial Impact:

Funding request for \$261,239 from local government members of the Water Resources Board. Lack of funding from local sources may discourage the Interstate Stream Commission from providing matching funds to complete the plan.

Mr. Jim Gross notified the WRB that the timing to have the opportunity at this juncture to provide a recommendation to the MRGCOG Board because it's at the March meeting of the Board of Directors where the Board will make a decision on asking for funding from the local governments. Mr. Gross gave a presentation on how this funding process works for the local governments.

Discussion and Comments:

- The Water Assemby has raised over \$100,000 up to date. This current fiscal year, they have raised over \$25,000 and half of that amount has been contributed to the public involvement program.
- From the Assembly's point of view, they are not comfortable with the division of labor as put forward by MRGCOG, but the Assembly has a session set for this Friday, February 16th with Fabrizio Bertoletti, Larry Blair, Jim Gross, Bob Wesseley, and Lee Brown to deal more specifically with roles and responsibilities and to discuss how those funds will be used.
- Mr. Lee Brown stated that he is very supportive of the funding request that was presented by Mr. Jim Gross.
- It was agreed to give any presentations to any local governments if needed.
- If any Board member would like a formal presentation given, they need to notify Mr. Jim Gross or Mr. Lee Brown.
- It was suggested to mail progress reports before asking for more funds and to all council and commission members that have not attended any meetings.
- An annual report will be completed for the April 11th meeting.

- The Water Assembly is seeking funds from sources such as, Public Service Co., Intel, Bureau of Reclamation, and the Economic Forum. MRGCOG receives local government funds.
- The Board needs to be accountable and identify where the funding is coming from and where the funding is contributed to.
- In the progress report, what would like to be seen is what the scope of work
 was, who has done what, how much it cost, either in dollars or in volunteer
 hours, and then from where, so that we can come up with a dollar amount.
- If this is going to be a partnership, this information needs to be combined to show what the resources that are going into this really are.
- There was a concern about the current selected areas in the scope of work such as, agriculture water supply options and public water supply options.
- As a community, the Board needs to come with some initial alternatives through some preliminary screening process that identifies alternatives that are acceptable to the public and feasible as assessed by a group of experts.
- This funding request needs to be revised and to reflect priorities.
- There needs to be an agreement with the Water Assembly on the level of funding.
- The intent of the meeting on Friday is to specifically define what the product will be at the end. Tasks will be detailed.
- The alternatives have not yet been defined or prioritized.
- The final revisions, if any, and the endorsements by the local governments would be obtained and submitted with the final draft to the Interstate Stream Commission for acceptance. These steps will be added to the next project schedule.

Tab 5. <u>Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan-Methodology for Evaluation of Preliminary</u> Alternatives:

WRB members received a briefing on this topic from Mary Murnane at the meeting of the WRB on this topic from Mary Murnane at the meeting of the WRB on March 14, 2001. The Alternatives Work Group for the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan has been working to develop a methodology for evaluating regional water resource management alternatives. A proposed methodology has been developed that is structured to obtain numeric ratings concerning both public preferences and technical feasibility, using the same evaluation criteria.

The Work Group is currently testing this methodology on a selected set of ten preliminary alternatives obtained from a larger set of alternatives that have been assembled and discussed by the Work Group. The selected alternatives have been sent to two groups for evaluation of The groups are: (1) a randomly selected group from the public who have no specialty expertise in water resources, and (2) a selected group of technically qualified people who do have some expertise in one or more fields of water resources management and planning. Participants have been asked to score the alternatives and return their scoring sheets to the Work Group.

Policy Ramifications:

Establishes an approach for evaluating and rating alternatives for regional water management.

Financial Impact:

Substantially completes work program requirements under the contract with the Interstate Stream Commission for work related to preliminary alternatives evaluation.

Mr. Joe Quintana, MRGCOG, gave a presentation on the Alternatives Analysis Process Flowchart. The Board also received a handout on the final draft of the Analysis Methodology For Regional Water Management Alternatives.

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Discussion and Comments:

- These draft alternatives statements that were evaluated were selected at random by Alternatives Work Group.
- The initial feedback from Ms. Mary Helen Follingstad, Interstate Stream Commission (ISC), was that she would have accepted something simpler than this therefore, it is believed that this will be accepted by the ISC.
- This evaluation process was given alternative categories to the Regional Water Planning Template, it does say that standards shall be established which were: Technical feasibility, political feasibility, social and cultural impacts, financial feasibility, implementation schedule, and physical, hydrological and environmental impacts. These were given by the ISC.

Tab 4. Accept the Draft Future Water Demand Report:

Mr. Quintana presented the following information:

Background:

Staff at the MRGCOG has prepared and distributed a report projecting future water demands as part of the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan. The MRGWRB held a workshop on July 11, 2001 to discuss the report and make recommendations to improve the format of the report. The Board continued discussion of the report at their meeting of August 8, 2001 and additional suggestions were made for further revisions to be made prior to the September meeting. In addition, the Water Assembly Action Committee has formed an Analysis Team which has reviewed and commented favorably on the report as well. Staff has incorporated numerous changes reflecting written comments received since the July workshop and recommends that the Board accept the attached draft report as the final draft for transmittal to the Interstate Stream Commission (ISC) and the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly.

Publication and distribution of the final draft will be made upon acceptance of the report by the ISC and Action Committee. The Action Committee is expected to take final action at their September 19 meeting.

Policy Ramifications:

This Future Water Demand Report will serve as a component of the Regional Water Plan. The report presents a base-case projection of future water consumption for the region and provides a basis and an urgency for developing water management alternatives to save or conserve water and increase the efficiency of water use throughout the region.

Financial Impact:

This report is funded by the ISC and the member governments of the MRGCOG.

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Discussion and Comments:

- The responsibility for this report has been passed from former MRGCOG staff member Mr. Jim Gross, to Mr. Quintana. Board Members commended Mr. Quintana on how he has handled the transition.
- Changes were made to the executive summary, conclusions, and introduction based on the recommendations made by a subcommittee of the MRGWRB, a subcommittee of the Analysis Team of the WA's Action Committee, and several individuals who submitted written comments. Minor changes were also made throughout the report for clarity and format standardization.
- In order to maintain the focus of the report on the baseline, three projection variations were provided as Appendix C.
- Ms. Woodard suggested that for future reports a protocol should be set up for tracking the status of the review process, and there should be a formal process to identify roles and responsibilities, including the roles and responsibilities of the MRGWRB and WA with respect to contract deliverables.
- Mr. Quintana summarized that the report still is subject to review and approval by the ISC. The technical report leaves open the possibility of follow-up reports that could be interpretive in order for the original report to be kept neutral.
- Mayor Aguilar expressed his concern that he had not had an opportunity to review the document as his agenda packet had not arrived, therefore he was uncomfortable voting on the document without review.
- Both Mr. Ed Richardson, Representative, Village of Corrales, and Commissioner Sapien expressed their satisfaction with the report.

Action Taken: Mr. Richardson made the motion to:

ACCEPT THE DRAFT FUTURE WATER DEMAND REPORT AS THE FINAL DRAFT TODAY AND SEND IT TO THE ISC.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sapien.

The motion passed with a vote of 7 to 1 with 1 abstention.

Those voting in favor: Ms. Behrend, Mr. Fernandez, Commissioner Henry Pacelli, Board Member Gonzales, Chair Pro Tem Murnane, Mr. Richardson, and Commissioner Sapien.

Those voting in opposition: Ms. Woodard.

Those abstaining: Mayor Aguilar.

 Ms. Woodard submitted a list of pending issues, for the record, to be forwarded to the ISC with the final draft (attached to the Summary of Proceedings).

Tab 5. Regional Water Planning Scope of Work:

Mr. Quintana presented the following information:

Background:

A detailed Scope of Work is being finalized for the next phase in the Regional Water Plan. It is anticipated that the Regional Water Plan will be completed in two years for submittal to the ISC. The Scope of Work will be an attachment to the contract between the MRGCOG and the ISC. The Scope of Work is comprised of 10 task descriptions and includes 29 subtasks. A summary review of the contents of the detailed Scope of Work was presented by MRGCOG staff.

MRGCOG's role in this phase of the Regional Water Plan will primarily be in a coordination capacity rather than a technical planning capacity. Technical work and work program oversight is to be provided by outside sources.

Policy Ramifications:

Water resource limitations in this region are, and will continue to be, a serious issue in terms such as water consumption, water quality, water rights, and sharing shortages during drought conditions. The Regional Water Plan will provide the most feasible alternatives for water management actions that can be applied at both regional and local levels.

Financial Impact:

The ISC is providing \$300,000 for a planning effort in this region that is estimated to cost well over \$1,000,000 before completion. Additional resources are being provided by Local Governments and in-kind services from the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly.

Discussion and Comments:

- These tasks and subtasks were developed by a committee comprised of Mr. Larry Blair, MRGWRB Chair, MRGCOG Staff, and Water Assembly representatives. Responsibility for each task and subtask was identified, as well as the deliverable. At the end of each task is an "approach" on how the task will be implemented.
- All of Task 10 is being funded from Local Government participation.

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The ISC has stated that the plan needs to be completed by June 2003

- so that ISC can combine the regional plans into a State plan. The ISC is putting together a framework for a Statewide Water Plan.
- Ms. Elaine Hebbard, Water Assembly, suggested that a subtask be developed for an implementation toolkit.
- Mr. Quintana noted if this was included in the Scope of Work, the
 toolkit should include alternatives in the form of written statements. A
 toolkit could be useful in coordinating with local governments and what
 will work for them.
- Local representatives will need to bring feasible alternatives that affect their area to the MRGWRB for discussion.

Tab 6. <u>Presentation on Regional Water Planning Public Comments Database:</u>

Mr. Quintana presented the following information:

Background:

The regional water planning process to date has generated many comments through various public events regarding water issues. Many of these comments have been documented, categorized, and inserted into a database for future reference in the development of the Regional Water Plan. MRGCOG staff presented a brief overview of this database and its contents.

Policy Ramifications:

Public comments provide a source of information in the development of the Regional Water Plan.

Financial Impact:

None.

Discussion and Comments:

- It was noted that there are 1,403 individualized comments in the database; 80% are from the community conversations.
- An alternative work group, primarily MRGCOG staff and Mr. Bob Prendergast, Water Assembly, put these comments into a database spreadsheet. This spreadsheet will be available for download on the MRGCOG website.
- The data fields can be used to sort information into categories for evaluation.
- By category, the spreadsheet contains comments that are 60% technical and political.

Tab 7. General Report from the Water Assembly:

Mr. Bob Wessley, Water Assembly, reported the following:

- The Water Assembly has developed a water balancing spreadsheet showing current water budget use, unfettered future water budget use, and desired future water budget use. This will be used in accomplishing subtask 1.2 of the Proposed Scope of Work. A distributable version should be available within one month.
- All of the evaluations of the alternatives will be put in an Alternative Action Database. The structure of this database should be available in approximately two weeks.
- A "Fall Campaign" is being planned to bring the balancing spreadsheet, database structure, future water demand, and UNM Institute for Public Policy (IPP) study to the public to increase their understanding.
- Mr. Robert Cordova, Rio Puerco Subregion, asked if the tasks and subtasks were prioritized or in chronological order.
 Response: Mr. Wessley stated that they are not in chronological order, that all are important and must be done. Tasks 1, 5, and 10 are the most critical. Task 10 provides the infrastructure needed to do the work.
- It was noted that of the dollar figures shown in the table, only the ISC and MRGCOG cash FY02 are "in the bank". All the other in-kind services and other supplemental cash are not guaranteed but are intended to be there.
- The program plan will be updated to give a timeline/schedule to help determine which tasks need to be accomplished before others can be started. This schedule will be weighted by which tasks currently have funding in place and which tasks are mandated by the ISC template.
- The Water Assembly still has five definitions to finalize. They are waiting to do this until the new Action Committee members have completed training.
- The Water Assembly has formalized a relationship with the Placitas Middle Planning Area. Each group will do their own plan and then bring the plans together.

Call to Order:

The October 10, 2001 Middle Rio Grande Water Resources Board (MRGWRB) meeting was called to order at 11:40 a.m. by Chairman Larry Blair, City of Albuquerque. Chair Blair noted the presence of a quorum.

Approval of the Agenda:

Chair Blair noted that the Water Assembly Report was added to the agenda as Tab 7a and that New or Unfinished Business was changed to Tab 7b.

Action taken:

Ms. Marianne Woodard, Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque, made the motion to:

APPROVE THE OCTOBER 10, 2001 AGENDA AS AMENDED.

The motion was seconded by Board Member Danny Hernandez, Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority (AMAFCA), and carried unanimously.

Tab 1. Chair's Report:

Chair Blair explained that he missed the last Board meeting because he was in Philadelphia. While there, he heard an architect's report on how the World Trade Center buildings collapsed. Chair Blair shared this information with the Board.

Chair Blair turned over the meeting to Mr. John Stomp, City of Albuquerque, for a presentation on the Water Resources Management Strategy. Before the presentation Mr. Stomp introduced Mr. James Chavez, City of Albuquerque Senior Engineer for Water Resources.

Discussion and Comments:

- The City of Albuquerque does not draw or release water for Belen, Bernalillo, or Los Lunas. These cities contract for their own water.
- 40% of Albuquerque's San Juan-Chama water has been leased to the
 District, 10-20% is lost to evaporation and other sources, and 40% is in
 storage. The effects of pumping are generally offset by water return flow.
 There has only been one time that the San Juan-Chama water was used to
 replace pumped water and that was before the United States Geological
 Survey (USGS) model came out.
- Water is metered going into and out of Abiquiu to measure water release and manage the diversion of water. At 130 cubic feet per second (cfs) the City starts curtailing diversions. At 70, cfs diversion will be stopped altogether.
- San Juan-Chama water is not currently being used. The City has a lot of water stored in Abiquiu and this is the water that will be used initially.

- The MRGCD (District) has it's own water and does not rely on City of Albuquerque water. The city has been supplying water for the farmers during times of drought, and may continue to do so as it will draw from ground water during droughts.
- Ms. Mary Murnane, Bernalillo County, asked Mr. Stomp to explain the
 difference between the information he presented and what was shown in a
 newsletter from Rio Grande Restoration. The newsletter showed that in the
 summer there would only be 250 cfs coming down the river and that the
 City of Albuquerque would use 2/3 of that, causing a 2/3 reduction in the
 river's flow.
 - Response: Mr Stomp stated that the actual cfs flowing past Albuquerque in the summer is 400 to 500 cfs. This is District water that is called from storage and flows to Isleta, San Acacia, etc. The City of Albuquerque only diverts 65 cfs of this native flow during the summer. When the flow does get below 250 cfs, the City of Albuquerque would begin curtailing diversion. This is shown in the model.
- It is anticipated that the implementation of this plan will be advertised in the near future. It is not necessary to do the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) before the implementation plan is advertised because the EIS is a separate process.
- No hearings have been scheduled, however, Mr. Stomp will be available to meet with individuals or groups for further discussion.

Acting Executive Director's Report:

There was no Acting Executive Director's report.

There were no public comments.

Tab 3. Approval of Summary of Proceedings:

Discussion and Comments:

- Ms. Marianne Woodard, Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque, asked that "including the roles and responsibilities of the MRGWRB and Water Assembly (WA) with respect to contract deliverables" be added to her comments on page 5, paragraph 4.
- Board Member Danny Hernandez, Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority (AMAFCA), noted that he did not attend the last meeting as shown on the attendance roster.

<u>Action Taken</u>: Mr. James Fernandez, Valencia County, made the motion to:

APPROVE THE SEPTEMBER 12, 2001 SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS AS AMENDED.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Henry Pacelli, City of Rio Rancho, and passed with a vote of 9 and with 1 abstention.

Those voting in favor: Chair Blair; Vice Chair Richard Jaramillo, City of Belen;. Mr. James Fernandez, Valencia County; Board Member Hector Gonzales, Middle Rio Grand Conservancy District; Ms. Murnane; Commissioner Henry Pacelli, City of Rio Rancho; Mr. Ed Richardson, Village of Corrales; Mr. Bradley Stebelton, Sandoval County; and Ms. Woodard.

Those voting in opposition: 0

Those abstaining: Board Member Hernandez abstained as he did not attend the September 12, 2001 meeting.

Tab 4. Regional Water Planning Scope of Work:

Mr. Joe Quintana, MRGCOG Staff, presented the following information

Action Summary:

The detailed Scope of Work for Phase II of the Regional Water Plan has been completed and, upon approval, will be attached to the contract between the MRGCOG and the Interstate Stream Commission (ISC). Over the two-year contract period, various levels of product review and approval will need to be carried out as the Scope of Work is accomplished. Therefore, standardized procedures for collaborative decision making between the MRGCOG and the Water Assembly are also proposed for approval by the Water Board.

Background:

The Scope of Work for Phase II of the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan has been completed after months of negotiation among the MRGCOG staff, the Chair of the Water Board, the Chair and Vice Chair of the Water Assembly, and ISC staff. This Scope of Work is intended to result in an approved Regional Water Plan that can be implemented by the local governments in the water planning region.

The Scope of Work is comprised of 10 tasks which includes 29 subtasks. A summary review of the contents of the Scope of Work was presented to the Water Board at the last meeting on September 12, 2001. Also, draft outlines were presented to the Water Board at previous meetings. This Scope of Work will be attached to the contract (Professional Services Agreement) between the MRGCOG and the ISC. It is anticipated that the contract will be executed within the next month. The complete Scope of Work was attached to the October agenda as a final draft for review.

Due to the many product deliverables that will be required by the Scope of Work, a process for reviewing and approving a variety of work products throughout the contract period has been developed by the Water Planning Coordinating Committee. The process was explained and presented by MRGCOG staff and representatives of the Water Assembly for approval by the Water Board as future guidance. Additionally, a memorandum written by Mr. Chris Blewett, Acting MRGCOG Executive Director, establishes the approach to the water program coordination and refers to a process flow diagram to further define decision making relationships.

Policy Ramifications:

The Regional Water Plan will be developed with extensive public involvement and continuous review and input by local governments. An adopted Regional Water Plan will provide a regional framework for maximizing the use of limited water resources. The Plan will recommend the most feasible alternatives for water management actions that can be applied at both regional and local levels.

Financial Impact:

The ISC is providing \$300,000 to this region for the planning effort. Additional resources are being contributed by local governments, and in-kind services will be provided from the Middle Rio Grande Water Assembly.

Action A - Discussion and Comments:

- There are approximately 200 recommendations, or suggestions for water management alternatives, that will be analyzed and organized into scenarios. These scenarios should be suitable region-wide for local governments and other entities to carry on a future water management program. They will include cost/benefit, political, and social impacts which could also benefit individual local governments.
- These scenarios will be considered in developing the Regional Water Plan Recommendations.
- It is important to educate the public and local governments, and get them involved in the process. This will be critical for "buy in" and support at the end of the process.
- The budget table on page 21 is a good summary of the project. Column 1 is what we would like to do, the next 5 columns are the core tasks that would be done with the \$1.2 million of currently committed resources. The last two columns are tasks that could be done with additional funds.
- Mr. Bob Wessely, Water Assembly, stated that this was a good package.
 He feels that the tasks are all on target and show a good division of labor between MRGCOG and the WA.
- Contract language has been worked out with ISC staff and has been satisfactorily completed, including a legal review.
- Chair Blair asked what would be the next step if the MRGWRB approves phase II of the SOW.

- Response: Mr. Wessely stated that the WA has already approved the SOW.
- Response: Mr Quintana stated that if the Board recommends approval of the SOW today, it would go to the Executive Board tomorrow for approval and then to the ISC.
- Ms. Murnane suggested that the funding requests to the local governments be submitted before December to allow time to present them to the local governments and try to get the funding into their budgets.
- Mr. Quintana stated that the usual procedure is to send a letter to the local governments to get on their agenda for a presentation.
- Chair Blair stated a progress report could be given at the local government meetings. Actual finished products could be shown for existing and future water demand. A presentation could then be made to show where the money would be spent to get the remaining work done.
- Mr. Wessely invited the MRGWRB to join the WA at the AMAFCA Board meeting in October.
- Ms. Murnane suggested that the Ground Water Protection Advisory Board and the County's Gross Receipts Tax Board could be other options for funding presentations in Bernalillo County.

Action Taken: Mr. Ed Richardson, Village of Corrales, made the motion to:

ACCEPT THE PHASE II SCOPE OF WORK FOR THE REGIONAL WATER PLAN.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Pacelli and carried unanimously.

Action B - Discussion and Comments:

- Mr. Wessely explained that the one month approval cycle shown in the flow diagram was developed to allow sufficient time for the SOW tasks to be accomplished in a 24 month timeframe. Typically, information is presented to the Boards one month, discussed the next month, and the item approved in the third month. The process shown in the flow diagram shortens this process to one month. The information for each task would be developed by another group and included in the Board meeting agenda packet that is mailed. This would give the Board Members 10 days to study the proposal so that it could be discussed and possibly approved, at the first meeting.
- Ms. Murnane suggested that the process be revised to a two month process with the item being placed on the agenda of one Board the first month and on the agenda of the other Board the second month. This would provide time for any recommended changes to be reviewed by Members of the second Board prior to their meeting.
- Board Member Hernandez recommended that a one month cycle be set up for small tasks, and that a two to three month cycle be set up for more complex tasks with anticipated recommendations for changes.

 Mr. Richardson stated that the process should be adopted as presented. Any unresolved issues would be routed back through the cycle.

Motion Made: Mr. Richardson made the motion to:

APPROVE THE PROPOSED DECISION MAKING PROCESS.

The motion was seconded by Board Member Hernandez.

Further Discussion

- Some of the deliverables legally need to go back to the full Board for approval and cannot be approved by a committee. The authority for approval of other deliverables can be delegated.
- The WA should be the first board to see the product and then the MRGWRB. This would give three weeks between the two meetings to review any recommended changes and the one month cycle approach could still be used.

Action Taken: Mr. Richardson amended the motion as follows:

THAT AN ACTION IN THE DECISION MAKING PROCESS MAY GO BACK TO THE MRGWRB FOR APPROVAL WHEN RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE COORDINATING COMMITTEE ARE DIFFERENT THAN WHAT WAS ORIGINALLY APPROVED BY THE MRGWRB BOARD

The amendment was seconded by Board Member Hernandez.

The amended motion passed unanimously.

Tab 5. Regional Water Planning Scope of Work:

Ms. Janice Carolan, MRGCOG Staff, presented the following information:

Action Summary:

A number of subcontracts have been identified in the Scope of Work for Phase II of the Regional Water Plan. It is recommended that the MRGCOG Executive Director be authorized to approve and execute all subcontracts.

Background:

The MRGCOG Executive Board will be taking action at their next meeting to authorize execution of a contract with the Interstate Stream Commission to

complete Phase II of the Regional Water Plan. A number of subcontracts for technical and planning activities have been identified in the Scope of Work for the next phase.

Selection Committees will be assembled to review all proposals and make a final recommendation based on established rating criteria to the Water Assembly Executive Committee for review and comment to the Executive Director who will then award the contract.

Due to the number of subcontracts identified in the Scope of Work and in order to streamline the approval process, it was suggested that the Regional Water Resources Board make a recommendation to the MRGCOG Executive Board to allow the Executive Director to approve and execute any subcontract regardless of total dollar amount.

Policy Ramifications:

Currently, the MRGCOG Executive Board authorizes release of Requests for Proposal and approves the selection of contractors for amounts in excess of \$20,000.00.

Financial Impact:

The total amount of the Interstate Stream Commission Contract for Phase II is \$300,000.00.

Action Taken: Ms. Woodard moved to:

AUTHORIZE THE MRGCOG EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO APPROVE AND EXECUTE ALL REGIONNAL WATER PLANNING SUBCONTRACTS.

Further Discussion and Comments

• It was noted that if the MRGCOG Executive Board is not comfortable with this action they will not approve it.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Fernandez and carried unanimously.

Tab 6. Goals and Objectives:

Mr. Quintana presented the following information:

Action Summary:

The Goals and Objectives for the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan need to be completed to provide general guidelines for Phase II of the Regional Water Plan. Some of the objectives under consideration have been accepted or approved by consensus; however, more discussion is required in order to finalize the objectives associated with the adopted goals. The MRGCOG staff is requesting directions to pursue completion of the Interim Goals and Objectives.

Background:

A Mission Statement, Goals, and Objectives are proposed elements of the Regional Water Plan. Interim Mission and Goals Statements have been approved by the Water Board. Since March of this year, discussion of the Objectives has been an item on the agenda at several meetings and workshops. However, to date, a complete list of objectives has not been finalized.

A working draft of suggested objectives (attached) has been prepared by the Water Assembly which seeks to explain the comments and perspectives of both the Water Assembly and the Regional Water Board. Ultimately, a common set of objectives will need to receive joint approval.

Policy Ramifications:

Goals and Objectives can provide a basis for the development and evaluation of the water planning alternatives to be recommended as part of the Regional Water Plan.

Financial Impact:

Goals and objectives are identified as deliverables in the Phase I Scope of Work for development of the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan which must close out before December 2001. Funding has been expended for the Phase I work.

Discussion and Comments:

There was a loss of a quorum.

Vice Chair Richard Jaramillo, Councillor, City of Belen, suggested that a subcommittee be created to pursue the next actions to complete the Interim Goals and Objectives.

Tab 7a. General Report from the Water Assembly:

Mr. Wessley, reviewed the products completed by the WA, the four major paths for planning our water future, the sample data base and spreadsheets the WA is working on, and how the SOW fits into the program.

The motion was seconded by Mayor Charles Aguilar,

Town of Bernalillo, and carried unanimously.

Tab 1. Chair's Report:

- Chair Blair announced that he will be retiring from the City of Albuquerque on December 31, 2001. November 30, 2001 will be his last day at work, therefore, this is his last MRGWRB meeting as Chair.
- Chair Blair noted the need to adjourn by 1:30 pm to accommodate the Regional Planning Organization (RPO) meeting scheduled for 2:00 p.m. in the same room.

Vice Chair Richard Jaramillo, City of Belen, said that he was sorry that Chair Blair was leaving and that the MRGWRB members would all miss him.

Tab 3. Approval of Summary of Proceedings:

Discussion and Comments:

Chair Blair noted the following changes:

- Page 3, Discussion and Comments, bullet 1, the word "control" should be changed to "contract for".
- Page 3, Discussion and Comments, bullet 2, the words "or given" should be removed and "evaporation" is misspelled.
- Page 6, Discussion and Comments, bullet 2, the word "become" should be changed to "be considered in developing".

Action Taken: Vice Chair Jaramillo made the motion to:

APPROVE THE OCTOBER 10, 2001 SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS AS AMENDED.

The motion was seconded by Ms. Marianne Woodard, Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque, and carried unanimously.

Tab 4. Subcommittee report on the Interim Goals and Objectives:

Mr. Joe Quintana, MRGCOG Staff and Ms. Woodard presented the following information:

Action Summary:

The Goals and Objectives Subcommittee met and prepared the Interim Goals and Objectives of the Regional Water Plan for transmittal to the Interstate Stream Commission (ISC). These goals and objectives will be subject to ongoing review and refinement throughout the duration of the alternatives analysis of the Regional Water Plan.

Background:

A Mission Statement, Goals, and Objectives are proposed elements of the Regional Water Plan. Interim Mission and Goals Statements have been approved by the MRGWRB and the Water Assembly (WA). Since March of this year, discussion of the Objectives has been an item on the agenda at several meetings and workshops. Both the WA Action Committee and the MRGWRB have been working concurrently on a set of objectives which are subordinate to the approved goals.

A working draft of consolidated suggestions for objectives was prepared by the WA and was distributed to the MRGWRB at the last meeting. The attached Mission Statement, Goals, and Objectives is an interim document which will be used as reference in the development and analysis of water management alternatives. Further refinement is required and will be carried out during the alternatives analysis phase in the development of the Regional Water Plan.

Policy Ramifications:

Goals and Objectives provide a basis and a measure for the development and evaluation of the water planning alternatives to be recommended as part of the Regional Water Plan.

Financial Impact:

Goals and objectives are identified as deliverables in the Phase I Scope of Work for development of the Middle Rio Grande Regional Water Plan which must close out before December 2001. Funding has been expended for the Phase I work.

Discussion and Comments:

- Chair Blair noted that the first sentence under Background should read "A Mission Statement, Goals, and Objectives are a requirement of the contract with ISC."
- The Interim Mission Statement, Goals and Objectives presented is the result of the MRGWRB Goals and Objectives subcommittee refining the original Goals and Objectives that were being reviewed by the WA and the MRGWRB. It is a consolidated version with WA variations noted and emphasized in brackets.
- There was general concern that even though this is an "interim" product, it will become an archive document and additional changes should be incorporated before forwarding it to the ISC. There was also concern that a document showing different perspectives from the MRWRB and the WA might reflect poorly on this region's planning efforts.
- It was re-emphasized that the purpose of this document is not to resolve disagreements. The document as shown is a good representation of the region's views on future water use issues.
- Ms. Woodard noted that the preamble was missing and suggested that it be put back in.
- Mr. Bob Wessely, WA, noted that he had several additions from the WA that should be included.
- Chair Blair asked Mr. Wessely to review these additions to see if they could be easily included in the existing document. (List attached)

Action Taken: Mayor Aguilar made the motion to:

AUTHORIZE ADDING THE PREAMBLE AND THE WA CHANGES, AND TRANSMIT THE INTERIM GOALS AND OBJECTIVES TO THE ISC.

The motion was seconded by Ms. Woodard and passed unanimously.

Tab 5. Decision Making Process for the Regional Water Planning Program:

Background:

The Scope of Work for Phase II of the Regional Water Plan has been approved and will be attached to the contract between the MRGCOG and the ISC. Over the two-year contract period, various levels of product review and approval will need to be carried out as the Scope of Work is accomplished. At the request of the MRGWRB, a revised flow chart showing standardized procedures for collaborative decision making between the MRGCOG and the WA has been prepared for discussion.

Discussion and Comments:

 Mr. Wessely presented the revised One Month Decision Making Process as approved by the MRGWRB at the October 10, 2001 meeting.

Tab 6. General Report from the Water Assembly:

Mr. Wessely presented the following information:

- Public participation activities include a newsletter, initial draft of the website, scheduling of three community conversation meetings in January 2002, and progress on a formal media communications plan.
- The WA Alternatives Working Team is compiling and categorizing an interim final list of alternatives, their costs, legal options, what they will do, etc. There are approximately 260 alternatives. These alternatives will be put together in a spreadsheet for public review.
- The WA Analysis Team is identifying 3-4 facts for the alternatives that can be used to reduce the list to a workable size for analysis. The other alternatives will be kept as part of the package but will not be analyzed in detail.
- The WA Analysis Team is putting together a water balancing spreadsheet that can be presented to the public when asking for their comments on water distribution.
- The WA has received a small grant from Albuquerque Metropolitan Area Flood Control Authority (AMAFCA). They have received a request to send a proposal for funding to the Bureau of Reclamation, and are working on a grant proposal for foundations.
- The WA made a presentation on Middle Rio Grande regional water planning to the Legislative Committee on Water and Natural Resources emphasizing the complexity of this process. Initiatives regarding domestic wells and water banking may be discussed during the upcoming New Mexico legislative session.

Mr. Wessely stated that he has been asked how much the Middle Rio Grande Water Plan has cost in both actual dollars and in-kind services. He has access to current funding information but needs information from the MRGWRB regarding early funding.

 Response: Early funding was identified as \$90,000 from the ISC in 1989-1990, and \$20,000 from the City of Albuquerque, Bernalillo County, and MRG Conservancy District for developing a proposal to the ISC in 1998. In-kind services were about one half of that.

Ms. Elaine Hebard, WA, noted that the WA needs everyone's support to prepare for the next community conversations. The topic for these meetings will be "what are you going to give up?"

Tab 7. New or Unfinished Business:

Response to John Salazar Letter:

Mr. F. Lee Brown, WA, reviewed the allegations in the subject letter and presented the following:

- This issue was discussed at the WA Action Committee last month.
 They gave a strong vote of confidence to Mr. Wessely and appointed a committee to develop a response.
- The MRGWRB has a partnership with the WA and should participate in the rebuttal.
- The letter does not correctly reflect the water planning process. Individuals participating in the process have a wide range of conflicting views, including those that are both pro- and condevelopment. There is no way that an individual could influence the outcome of the water planning process.
- The WA asks their officers to separate their personal views from their WA roles. Mr. Wessely does this very well. Many people were not even aware that Mr. Wessely had personal water issues.

Several MRGWRB members shared their own experiences and views regarding public vs. personal issues.

Mr. Quintana noted that the responsibilities, membership and voting mechanism of the Water Providers Council are included in the Bylaws of the Water Resources Board.

Tab 5 Principle Policies for Maintaining the Region's Future Water Supply

At a special meeting of the Water Resources Board on August 22, 2003, three Principle Policies for the Regional Water Plan were approved. Those Principles were discussed at length and changes agreed upon as follows: (changes noted in italics)

Water Principle I: Ground Water

We encourage adoption and implementation of policies that conserve use of groundwater in the Middle Rio Grande sub-region to create a reserve to deal with drought, prevent subsidence and mitigate other negative effects of groundwater depletion.

Water Principle II: Surface Water

We encourage adoption and implementation of policies that conserve use of surface water. Any additional water that is available should be stored upstream and/or returned to the aquifer using appropriate technology. This principle is to reduce evaporative losses.

Water Principle III: Designing Implementation Mechanisms

We encourage jurisdictions in the region to work together to design implementation mechanisms for the plan that are *effective*, fair, wise, equitable, *legal* and appropriate to local community *concerns*.

The Principles will come before the Water Resources Board as an Action Item at the October 8 meeting.

Tab 6 Report on Development of Converged Scenario

Mr. Wessely reported that the Converged Scenario is now the Preferred Scenario. It is available as Item 9.3 in the Regional Water Plan which is available at the website, www.waterassembly.org/1wamast/chplan.html.
